Jasper was abandoned near a dumpster in the Atlanta area - left alone and neglected for the first couple of months of his life. He was brought to **Paws Rescue Shelter (PRS)** after a compassionate friend found him.

After arrival at the shelter, our medical team noticed that his tiny collar had become much too tight, ultimately becoming embedded into his neck. Fortunately, it had not cut into the muscles of Jasper's neck so it was immediately removed without further damage.



In addition to having the collar removed, Jasper also received a thorough medical exam as well as the social attention he had been missing. After a couple of weeks of companionship, care and nourishment here at the shelter, Jasper began to grow like all healthy puppies do.



After several months with no human or animal interaction, it was great to see Jasper's transformation. He went from being shy and malnourished to well-adjusted and playful - always soaking up as much attention as he could get.

As a result of sharing his story online, a family recently adopted Jasper and took him home! Jasper has a very happy ending thanks to the compassionate friend who rescued him, the wonderful family that adopted him, and your support. It's your continued support which enables us to care for these precious animals and **transform their lives one paw at a time.**

- 32% are adopted
- 27% are euthanized
- 5% are returned to owners


Outreach Spotlight

Helping Foster Group With Joint Rescue Effort

Recently, a private foster group that works with Fulton County Animal Control discovered that one of their foster families was hoarding so many animals that they couldn't care for them all. Animal Control rescued most of the animals; however, we brought back 7 cats to our shelter which were treated by our medical team and then cleared for adoption.

In total, we helped rescue 23 dogs and cats from the inhumane environment. Rescue efforts like this could not be achieved without the generous support of friends like you.
